



CURRENT PROJECTS

Amalima Loko (2020-2025), USAID Resilience Food Security Activity, in partnership with CNFA, Mercy Corps, Dabane Water Workshops, Manoff Group, International Medical Corps, Implemented in Binga, Hwange, Lupane, Nkayi, Tsholotsho. The program is designed to improve food security in Zimbabwe through increased food access and sustainable watershed management

KAZA Agro-ecology and Conservation Project (2022-2024), in partnership with WWF in Binga district. The program demonstrates climate smart agro-ecological practices that enhance sustainable food production in the drought prone area.

School Feeding Programme (2021-ongoing) in partnership with Mary's Meals International, in Umguza and Bubi District. School children receive a meal of fortified Corn Soya Blend (CSB) prepared on site every day at their place of education.

Gateway Zimbabwe Project (2017-ongoing), in partnership with Trust Africa and Kufunda Village, with a national reach across Zimbabwe. At the centre of Gateway Zimbabwe is the dream of restoration and re-weaving of the social fabric in order to rebuild trust and create foundations for sustainable development – in friendships, families, communities and throughout the social and political sphere.

Library Establishment and Support Programme (2005-ongoing) with United States Africa Children's Fellowship aimed at improving education across Matabeleland region. Central focus is libraries being developed and stocked, sports education equipment being donated and early childhood development centres being set up.

Integrated Nutrition, WASH, and Protection Project (2023 – 2024) in partnership with Save the Children International under the USAID/Bureau for Humanitarian Assistance (BHA) ensuring that vulnerable households with under-5 children and pregnant and lactating women (PLW) in Bulilima and Mangwe Districts have equitable access to quality, safe and inclusive Nutrition, WASH and Protection services in their respective communities.

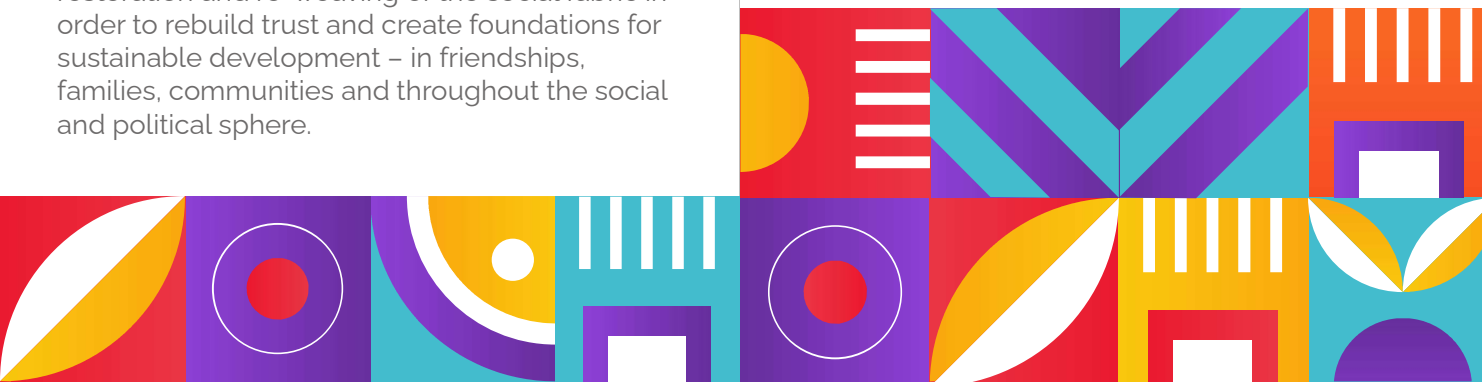


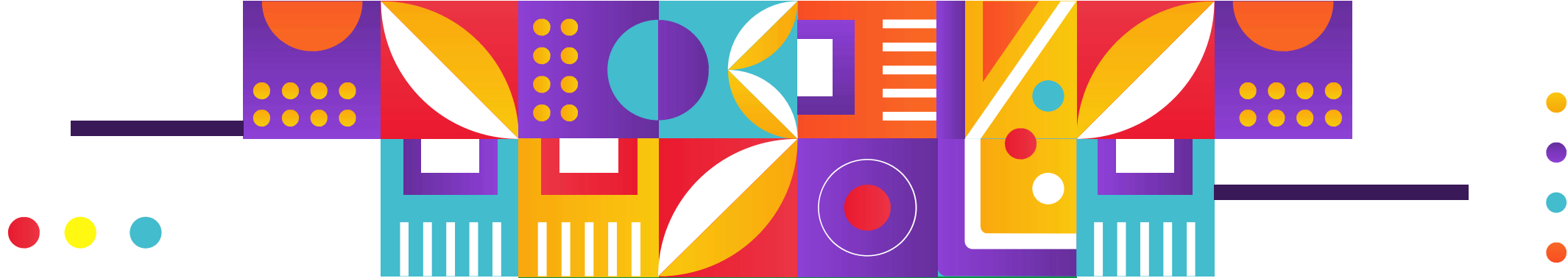
